

# Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

## MANDATORY CONDITIONS

- 1 No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
  - (a) at any time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (b) at any time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
  
- 2 Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
  
- 3 This Licence/Club Registration Certificate is subject to such further conditions as are consistent with any restrictions imposed on the use of the premises for the existing licensable activities under the licence by virtue of the enactments hereinafter set out:-

The Children and Young Person Act 1933  
The Cinematograph (Safety) Regulations 1955  
The Sporting Events (Control of Alcohol etc) Act 1985
  
- 4 When door supervisors or other persons carrying out security activities at specified times are employed such individuals must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

For the purposes of this condition "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2 (1)(a) Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 applies.
  
- 5 Any alcohol supplied for consumption off the premises must be in a sealed container.
  
- 6 (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-

  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
    - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
    - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

**(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;**

**(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;**

**(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).**

**7 The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.**

**8 (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.**

**(2) The designated premise supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.**

**(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-**

**(a) a holographic mark, or**

**(b) an ultraviolet feature.**

**9 The responsible person must ensure that -**

**(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks are sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -**

**(i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;**

**(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and**

**(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;**

**(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and**

**(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.**

- A. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price**
- B. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph A -**
- (a) "duty" is to construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;**
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -**
- $$P=D+(D \times V)$$
- Where-**
- (i) P is the permitted price**
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and**
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol**
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -**
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,**
- (ii) the designated premise supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or**
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;**
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and**
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994**
- C. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph B would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny**
- D. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by paragraph (b) of paragraph B on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax**
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.**

## **Annex 2 – Conditions Consistent With The Operating Schedule**

### **PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER**

- 1** A digital Closed Circuit Television system (CCTV) will be installed and maintained in good working order and be correctly time and date stamped.  
The system will incorporate sufficient built-in hard-drive capacity to suit the number of cameras installed, whilst complying with data protection legislation.  
CCTV will be capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions, particularly facial recognition.  
Cameras will encompass all ingress and egress to the premises, outside areas and all areas where the sale/supply of alcohol occurs.  
There will be a minimum of 14 days recording.  
The system will have a minimum of a simplex multiplexing facility and be recording for 24 hours a day.  
The system will incorporate a means of transferring images from the hard-drive to a format that can be played back on any desktop computer.  
The digital recorder will have the facility to be password protected to prevent unauthorised access, tampering, or deletion of images.  
There will be at all times a member of staff on duty who is trained in the use of the equipment and upon receipt of a request for footage from a governing body, such as Cleveland Police or any other Responsible Authority, be able to produce the footage within a reasonable time, e.g. 24hrs routine or less if urgently required for investigation of serious crime.  
In the event of a technical failure of the CCTV equipment the Premise Licence Holder/DPS must report the failure to Police on contact number 01642 302360 immediately.
- 2** The premises licence holder will maintain an incident reporting system at the premises at all times. Such a system will detail in brief any incident of disorder/injury/ejection/drug misuse and /or seizure and will include the date and time of the incident. Relevant entries shall be produced to an authorised officer of the Police or Licensing Authority on request.
- 3** The DPS and all staff will ensure that no open vessels are taken off the premise by customers except for consumption in any outside area under the control of the premise licence holder.
- 4** The premises licence holder will operate a Challenge 21 policy at the premises at all times which will require any individual who appears under the age of 21 seeking to purchase alcohol to provide satisfactory proof of age that they are over the age of 18. Adequate notices will be displayed on the premises to inform/remind customers and staff that such a policy is in operation.
- 5** All staff with the exception of kitchen staff, will receive training in the law governing the sale of alcohol to under age persons, those seeking to purchase alcohol on behalf of under 18's (proxy sales) and those appearing to be under the influence of alcohol and the relevant company policies including Challenge 21 to address those areas. Refresher training will take place twice yearly.
- 6** Training records will be maintained during the employment of the staff member and made available to an authorised officer of the Police or Licensing Authority on request.

- 7 There shall be adequate notices displayed on the premise indicating that the sale of alcohol to those under the age of 18 is illegal and that those adults who buy alcohol for immediate disposal to those under the age of 18 are committing an offence.
- 8 A written drugs policy to the satisfaction of Cleveland Police must be maintained at the premises and a drugs safe must be maintained and emptied regularly.
- 9 The premises licence holder will ensure that there are sufficient staffing levels including managers to encourage responsible behaviour on the premises at all times.
- 10 Non-alcoholic beverages including soft drinks, water, coffee and tea shall be available at all times, sale by retail of alcohol carried out at the premises.

## **PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE**

- 1 Any music shall be played within the premises only.
- 2 Use appropriate management controls to reduce the likelihood of customers causing noise disturbance to local residents when vacating the premises. This should include placing at all exits from the premises, in a place where they can be seen and easily read by the public, notices requiring customers to leave the premises and the area quietly. (Note, this may also include a reference to vehicles)
- 3 No glass or material or bottles shall be deposited in any skip, bin or other container of a like nature, located in the open air outside of the premises, between the hours of 22.00 and 08.00 and any such skip, bin or container shall not be removed from the premises between these hours.
- 4 The use of the external seating area by patrons for the consumption of food or drink shall be restricted to the hours of 09.00 - 22.00hrs and no music shall be played in the external seating area and no use of artificial lighting likely to cause a nuisance to local residential properties.
- 5 All external areas of the premises within the control of the licensee shall be maintained in a clean and tidy condition free of litter including glasses and harbourage for vermin.
